Our Commitment to Women's Mental Health

At Sunflower Mountain Mental Health (SMMH), we recognize the unique mental health needs of women and individuals assigned female at birth. We provide **compassionate**, **gender-inclusive**, **and evidence-based care** to support mental wellness at all stages of life, including during pregnancy, postpartum, and menopause.

Medicare & Medicaid Coverage for Women's Mental Health

Under Medicare and Medicaid, you have access to the following mental health services:

- Screenings for Perinatal & Postpartum Depression
- Mental Health Therapy & Counseling for anxiety, depression, PTSD, and trauma
- Psychiatric Services & Medication Management
- Substance Use Disorder Treatment for Pregnant & Postpartum Individuals
- Support for Menopause-Related Mental Health Concerns

If you are experiencing symptoms of **depression**, **anxiety**, **or emotional distress**, you have the right to seek treatment under **federal healthcare protections**.

Rights for Pregnant & Postpartum Individuals

Medicare and Medicaid provide additional **protections and access** for pregnant and postpartum individuals, including:

• Extended Medicaid Mental Health Coverage (at least 12 months postpartum in many states)

- Postpartum Depression & Anxiety Treatment Without Discrimination
- Access to Care Without Fear of Coercion (you cannot be forced into treatment)
- **Confidential Mental Health Services** to protect your privacy

If you are struggling with your mental health during pregnancy or postpartum, you are **not alone**—help is available.

Non-Discrimination & Gender-Inclusive Mental Health Care

SMMH is committed to providing mental health care without discrimination based on:

- Pregnancy or postpartum status
- Gender identity or expression
- Reproductive choices
- History of trauma, abuse, or intimate partner violence
